OLSE -120 Years and counting! - On 20 November we celebrated the Feast of St Edmund with a Mass at OLSE; AND afterwards, to recognise the anniversary of our church we had drinks and refreshments in the Garnett Room..... and a cake with Fr Peter doing the honours!



Parish Christmas Fair at OLSE - a good crowd turned up for our Christmas Fair at the end of November, including families and people from other parishes. All the bottles on the tombola, and most of the books and gifts were quickly snapped up, which together with the raffle and generous donations raised over £500 for children affected by the war in Ukraine.

The church in Ukraine linked to our Ukranian family here were able to prepare Christmas gifts including fresh fruit for 20 children from our donations!

## THE LETTER - A Film to Make us Think....

The showing of the feature / documentary film "The Letter" – the title refers to the Laudato Si' encyclical which marks its 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary this year – was a great success. It was attended by 44 people, both from our parish and other churches in the area.

The Letter gives us an insight into the reality of climate change in different parts of the world: Pope Francis invited

climate activists from Senegal, India, Brazil and Australia, and through meeting with him, we learn of the threat not only to the land and livelihood of the community, but the threat to the life of one of the activists from the big business that is working in his country. The power of the film left some in tears, but at the same time it engendered hope and huge esteem for the people at the front line of the battle against the degradation of the Earth.

Conversation over the lunch of home-made soups and cakes afterwards centred on the message of the film, and generated rich thoughts, reflection and ideas.

The response to both the film and the get together was overwhelmingly positive:

"Such a good film; I learned so much. And it's made me think about what I can do in my own little way to be more careful in caring for our planet."

"I can't say I enjoyed the film exactly — it's such a sobering, worrying thing — but I really did enjoy the opportunity to open our church to our Christian sisters and brothers"

"It's so good to get together with people from other churches"

"We must do more things like this!"
