Pope Francis' March message, on the theme of <u>families in crisis</u>, includes a <u>powerful message of forgiveness</u>: "Even when there's no possibility of the 'happy ending' we'd like, God's grace gives us the strength to forgive, and it brings peace, because it frees us from sadness, and, above all, from resentment."

CARE NOT KILLING - THE ASSISTED SUICIDE BILL: IMPORTANT Petition

Care Not Killing (CNK) has launched a PETITION calling on MPs to reject proposals for an assisted suicide law in England and Wales.

In April (or possibly May), MPs will again vote on the Terminally Ill Adults (End of Life) Bill. Despite a disappointing initial vote of 330-275 in favour, there is now a realistic chance the Bill can be defeated.

The Independent newspaper reports that 142 MPs who initially backed the Bill could withdraw their support (citing safeguarding concerns). NOW is the time for Catholics to make their voices heard.

Please consider signing the Care Not Killing petition - available at both churches - which calls on MPs to vote against legalising assisted suicide in England and Wales.

The Terminally III Adults (End of Life) Bill would make vulnerable people - including the elderly and disabled - feel a burden on family or carers resulting in pressure to end their lives.

This week, Lenten Lunches will be held at St Mary's Parish Church in Heacham on Thursday 20th March, and at St Edmund's CofE church in Hunstanton on Friday 21st. Both events start with the service at 11.30, followed by lunch. All welcome - please sign up if you intend to stay for the lunch.

Church communities in Heacham will be <u>visiting local care homes</u> during Lent to lead short services on the mornings of 31st March and 7th April. These visits are similar to the very well received services held in Advent. It's hoped that we will have some parishioners join with this venture.
