### CARE NOT KILLING - THE ASSISTED SUICIDE BILL: IMPORTANT Petition

Care Not Killing (CNK) has launched a PETITION calling on MPs to reject proposals for an assisted suicide law in England and Wales. In April (or possibly May), MPs will again vote on the Terminally Ill Adults (End of Life) Bill. The Independent newspaper reports that 142 MPs who initially backed the Bill could withdraw their support (citing safeguarding concerns). NOW is the time for Catholics to make their voices heard.

Please consider signing the Care Not Killing petition - available at both churches: <u>last chance to sign is Sunday 23rd</u>- which calls on MPs to vote against legalising assisted suicide in England and Wales.
