JUBILEE 2025 - PILGRIMS OF HOPE - Jubilee themes: REST AND WORSHIP During this month of April, we will focus on the theme of Rest and Worship. At this sad time of Papal Interregnum brought about by the death of Pope Francis, it is fitting that we continue to reflect on the Jubilee theme of rest and worship with some of his thoughts and teachings around worship:

- Pope Francis viewed worship as the breath of faith, its most proper expression, a cry that issues from the heart of those who believe and entrust themselves to God.
- He encouraged a personal and intimate dialogue with God through prayer, emphasizing the importance of listening to God's voice.
- He highlighted the importance of integrating worship with service to others, seeing both as expressions of faith.
- He encouraged Christians to proclaim the Gospel courageously and fearlessly, bringing the word of God into the world.
- He emphasized the importance of communal worship, where believers gather together to praise God and to support one another.
