A reflection on the election of our new pope, Leo XIV

Pope Leo XIV, the 267th occupant of the throne of St Peter, is the 1st Augustinian pope (https://www.vaticannews.va/en/pope/news/2025-05/biography-of-robert-francis-prevost-pope-leo-xiv.html). When a Pope is also a member of a religious order, they bring the charism, or unique gift, of that order to their papacy. The Pope's order's charism can influence their leadership, policies, and overall approach to the Church. The opening words of St. Augustine's Rule say: "We are to be of one mind and heart on the way to God. The activity of our journey is characterized by three essential elements: the constant search for God by means of a deep interior life; the practical love of neighbour; and the constant pursuit of truth."

Lord, source of eternal life and truth, give to your shepherd a spirit of courage and right judgment, a spirit of knowledge and love. By governing with fidelity those entrusted to his care, may he, as successor to the Apostle Peter and Vicar of Christ, build your Church into a sacrament of unity, love and peace for all the world. Amen.
