JUBILEE 2025 - PILGRIMS OF HOPE - Jubilee themes: FOOD POVERTY

In our weekly newsletters during this Jubilee Year of Hope we reflect on one of the six themes on which we are encouraged to focus. Throughout this month of June we are looking at Food Poverty. Food poverty often points to a complex set of problems faced by the most vulnerable in the community, necessitating a more robust response that aims to help individuals address other needs, such as fuel poverty, unmanageable debt, homelessness, low literacy, substance abuse, mental health issues, child care issues, and domestic violence, either directly or through referrals to other local services who have the expertise and resources to address these issues. Restoring dignity to those who live with food poverty is a priority for organisations working with food poverty, whether through providing assistance, extending the hand of friendship and solidarity, alleviating the stress that accompanies deprivation, or helping keep families together.
