**JUBILEE 2025 - PILGRIMS OF HOPE - Jubilee themes: REST AND WORSHIP**

This month of August, season of holidays and travel, we return to the Jubilee theme of Rest and Worship

Jesus comes to restore us to God's eternal rest! He launches his ministry with the proclamation of the year of favour, described in Leviticus 25, as the sabbatical year and the Year of Jubilee, emphasizing rest for the land and the release of debts and land ownership. It covers aspects like the sabbatical year (every seventh year) where the land is to lie fallow, and the Year of Jubilee (every 50th year) where land reverts to its original owners and debts are forgiven.

**Assisted Suicide Bill in the Lords** - Catherine Robinson from **Right to Life UK** writes: We are expecting the Leadbeater assisted suicide Bill to have its Second Reading in the House of Lords on Friday 12 September.

There is a real chance we can defeat this Bill in the Lords - and the assisted suicide lobby knows it. That's why their campaign in the Lords is now in full swing. Several Peers have told us they're getting a large amount of correspondence urging them to support the Bill.

It's crucial that Peers also hear from those of us who *oppose* this dangerous change in the law so we've just launched a new EasyAction tool to help you email a few Peers directly. It creates a tailored message that highlights a key concern with the Bill and ensures it reaches the right Peers.

**Season of Pilgrimage 3** - Next Sunday, 17<sup>th</sup> August, the local Red Mount Procession will take place in King's Lynn, leaving Our Lady's London Road at 3pm, and processing to the 15<sup>th</sup> Century Chapel of Our Lady of the Red Mount in The Walks. This profound ceremony has been carried out since 1897 when the Shrine of Our Lady of Walsingham was restored by Pope Leo XIII.

**A Season of Pilgrimage 4** - Three "perpetual pilgrims" will pass through Dersingham (on 6<sup>th</sup> September) and King's Lynn (on 7<sup>th</sup> September) on their way from Norwich to Nottingham as part of the National Jubilee Walking Pilgrimage of Hope.
