JUBILEE 2025 - PILGRIMS OF HOPE - Jubilee themes: REST AND WORSHIP This month of August, season of holidays and travel, we return to the Jubilee theme of Rest and Worship

A theology of rest and worship emphasizes the connection between ceasing from labour and engaging in praise and adoration of God. It highlights that rest is not merely the absence of work but a purposeful act of acknowledging God's sovereignty and experiencing His presence, drawing on the example of God resting on the seventh day after creation and Jesus' invitation to find rest in him. This concept is rooted in the biblical narrative, particularly the Sabbath commandment, and extends to understanding rest as a spiritual discipline that nourishes the soul and deepens one's relationship with God.

<u>Missio Boxes</u> The Summer magazine is now out and is available to pick up in both churches. For those with collection boxes look out for information on the collection of these, which will be organised in the next few weeks.

The annual <u>Season of Creation</u> is nearly upon us: running from 1st September to 4th October (the Feast of St Francis), this is a time for Christians to come together in prayer and action for Creation. There will be activities and suggestions in the parish as to how we can participate and take action to make a difference. The first event will be on <u>Monday 1st September</u>, when the 10am Mass at OLSE will be the new "<u>Mass for the Care of Creation</u>" officially titled <u>Missa pro custodia creationis</u>. This is a new votive Mass in the Roman Missal dedicated to celebrating and reflecting on God's creation. It was formally introduced by Pope Leo XIV and is intended to be a public liturgical prayer focused on the theme of caring for our common home. We hope as many people as possible will be able to attend to mark the start of the Season of Creation.

The <u>blue lantern</u> installed by the icon of <u>Our Lady at OLSE</u> is available for prayer requests. If you wish to have a 7 day candle burning there, please enter your details against an available week on the list.

<u>Assisted Suicide Bill in the Lords</u> - Catherine Robinson from <u>Right to Life UK</u> writes: We are expecting the Leadbeater assisted suicide Bill to have its Second Reading in the House of Lords on Friday 12 September.

There is a real chance we can defeat this Bill in the Lords - and the assisted suicide lobby knows it. That's why their campaign in the Lords is now in full swing. Several Peers have told us they're getting a large amount of correspondence urging them to support the Bill.

It's crucial that Peers also hear from those of us who *oppose* this dangerous change in the law [so w]e've just launched a new EasyAction tool to help you email a few Peers directly. It creates a tailored message that highlights a key concern with the Bill and ensures it reaches the right Peers.

This profound ceremony has been carried out since 1897 when the Shrine of Our Lady of Walsingham was restored by Pope Leo XIII.

A Season of Pilgrimage 4 - The National Jubilee Walking Pilgrimage of Hope, will pass through Dersingham (on 6th September) and King's Lynn (on 7th September) on their way from Norwich to Nottingham, where they will join pilgrims from all corners of the country. They are due to arrive at StC at around 5pm, when we hope many parishioners will be at the church to welcome them, and offer refreshments and moral support.
