JUBILEE 2025 - PILGRIMS OF HOPE - Jubilee themes: MODERN SLAVERY
We return this week to the first Jubilee theme we looked at, back in February,
Modern Slavery. As a refresher on what was outlined back then, so this month
we reflect again on what the late Pope Francis described as "an open wound in
