Guided by the Church 1: DILEXI TE: Pope Leo has issued his **first apostolic exhortation** (personal and pastoral encouragement to the faithful).

Dilexi te means "**I have loved you**" and echoes the title of Pope Francis' last encyclical letter **Dilexit Nos** ("he loved us"), on devotion to the Sacred Heart. The title is taken from the words of Jesus in Revelation 3:9 and is addressed directly "to all Christians on love for the poor" - that's us!

Pope Leo has built on the work begun by Pope Francis, who was preparing in the last months of his life an Apostolic Exhortation on the Church's care for the poor. **Dilexi te** can be found at https://www.vatican.va/content/leo-xiv/en/apost_exhortations/documents/20251004-dilexi-te.html. Guided by the Church 2: Nostra Aetate 60th Anniversary falls on Tuesday 28th October. This 2nd Vatican Council document, which translates as "In Our Time", It marked an irreversible turning point in relations between the Catholic Church and Judaism, in the wake of the steps taken by Pope John XXIII. It also significantly changed Catholicism's approach toward non-Christian religions, and is considered a foundational text for dialogue with other religions.
