Support Needed for Families in Kyiv: Pope Leo has added his voice once again to the calls for prayer and support for those suffering in Ukraine. On Sunday last, speaking after the recitation of the Angelus prayer in St Peter's Square, the Pope noted that *“even in these days, Ukraine continues to be struck by relentless attacks, leaving entire populations exposed to the cold of winter. I follow what is happening with sorrow, I am close to those who suffer, and I pray for them,”* he said, and he noted that the prolonged conflict causes *“ever more serious consequences for civilians, widens the rift between peoples and pushes a just and lasting peace further away. I urge everyone to intensify their efforts to end the war,”* he appealed (source: Vatican News).
