

We came together for a number of fundraising events last year: the Pancake evening in February, the Strawberry Fayre in June, A Coffee and Cake sale morning in October and in December, the Advent Fayre -which included some handmade Christmas gifts



In total, we raised a sum of £2455 which you generously donated for The British Red Cross, Ukrainian Orphans, and King's Lynn Night Shelter, as well as for our own Parish funds.

Sharing our gifts and skills with our parish – We wanted to celebrate the many people in our parish who give their time, knowledge and skills to ensure that we can continue to do all the things we do. We discovered that nearly half of our congregation contribute in some way – often behind the scenes. Many of them attended and enjoyed the lunch put on for them. Ecumenical events – Our relationship with others in the Christian community also continued to grow last year. In the Holy Father, Pope Francis' last Jubilee Year: Pilgrims of Hope, it was particularly special that all the other churches fully supported our proposal to base that year's Faith Services and meals around the theme of Hope.

We also took part in the joyous Songs of Praise (and picnic) on Hunstanton Green. And earlier in the year in the Ecumenical Lenten Soup programme – our own service and soup session raised an additional £145 which we donated to the local foodbank.

We hope that our fellowship with the Christian Community in our area can be further developed this year, and very much encourage everyone to look out for opportunities to take part in joint events.
